We are now calling for participants in the EBA Minamata Fieldwork program for the year 2026: **July 30 - Aug 6 (8 days)**. During the one-week program, participants will be given a special opportunity to enjoy hands-on experience while observing and examining the local issues at the site of the Minamata area, to join minds and hands in groups, and to articulate on the issues by making use of the collected data and observations in the field.

*\*Please note that the fieldwork may be rescheduled due to unexpected events.*

## About this EBA Fieldwork Program

**Minamata city** is located in Kyushu island, the southern part of Japan. The city is known for Minamata disease, caused by mercury pollution from a chemical factory in the 1950s. It is the first disease caused by food chain contamination due to environmental pollution.

The Minamata Fieldwork 2026 program includes workshops and fieldwork-related activities. The basic method of the Evidence-Based Approach will be introduced to the participants before going to the field. They will then visit various related facilities, such as the factory, workplaces of the victims, museums, and academic institutions, for a deeper investigation of the issues faced by the local community and the evolution of the city since the Minamata Disease incident. Through intensive observations and interactions with local residents, participants will have the opportunity to combine and compare the different perspectives from diverse stakeholders in Minamata, from the government, academics, the private sector, Minamata Disease survivors, younger generations, etc.

Based on the evidence collected, participants, divided into several groups, will come up with their findings and propose their solutions. Each group includes both Japanese and non-Japanese participants. Participants will receive a certificate from the EBA Project upon completion of the program.

## Language Requirement

- All lectures will be provided in English. English skills are required; participants should be at least able to carry on conversations in English.
- For Keio students (慶應生),
  - Japanese language conversation skill is also required (水俣市で日本語を使い、現地の方々とのコミュニケーションをサポートしていただきます。)





## Online Course Requirement: "Introduction to Evidence-Based Approach Course"

As indicated in the schedule below, participants must take the online common Course (real-time sessions and on-demand lectures) prior to the fieldwork. Completion of the course is required to participate in the fieldwork.

### Target and Capacity

This program is for both undergraduate and graduate students. The expected number of recruited students is about :

- SOI Asia, EBA Project partner universities- 14 students
- Keio University - 4 students
